- ❑ Iraqi-British architect
- ❑ Born on 31 October 1950, died in 2016 aged 65
- ❑ Grew up in Iraq, attended school in England and Switzerland and moved to London in the 1970s. She then became a British citizen
- ❑ Graduated from university in 1977 and opened her own architectural firm in 1980: Zara Hadid Architects
- ❑ She taught architecture at some of the best universities in the world: Harvard, Columbia, Cambridge and more
- ❑ She is known for her unique style
